

THE ESTORIL GLOBAL ISSUES DISTINGUISHED BOOK PRIZE

RULES FOR ELIGIBILITY

(Applicable for books published between June 2017 and December 2018)

1. The Estoril Conferences awards every two years **The Estoril Global Issues Distinguished Book Prize** for the best book on Globalization.
2. Eligible books must deal with significant global issues. Priority will be given to books that seek to provide both new analyses as well as new policy perspectives on global issues.
3. The prize consists of 15.000 Euro (fifteen thousand Euros).
4. Books can be co-authored by a maximum of two authors, but no collective edited volumes will be admitted.
5. All books applying must have been published between June 2017 and December 2018.
6. Deadline for submission is **October 31, 2018**. Ten copies of each title must be delivered to – **Estoril Conferences, Edifício Cascais Center, Rua Manuel Joaquim Avelar, 118 - 2ºPiso, 2750-421 | Cascais | Portugal**, plus a PDF copy in order to simplify the delivery to the Jury. When the books are not published in English, an equal number of printed and bounded copies of an English translation must also be provided.
7. A shortlist of up to five nominee titles will be announced by 31 December 2018.
8. The winning book will be announced in February 2019.
9. All titles must be submitted by the publisher or the author(s). It is their responsibility to ensure that the books and copies of the respective English translation when applicable arrive in a timely and cost-free manner to the postal address indicated by the prize manager.
10. Each submission must be sent to awards@estorilglobal.org, with the following information:
 - a. book publication date
 - b. a general overview of its contents
 - c. a short CV of the author(s)
 - d. a photograph of the author (300dpi's quality)
 - e. the book design (Europe & International)
11. Receipts will be sent for accepted submissions. The publisher and authors will be notified should their book be shortlisted or chosen for the prize.
12. **The award will only be delivered** if the author(s) agree(s) to give at least one public lecture and one book signing at the Awards Ceremony at the Estoril Conferences. If this is not possible, the prize will be awarded to the following book that the Jury selected.

13. The evaluation of the books and deliberation of the winner will be made by an internationally renowned jury – This year chaired by Matthew Kaminski – with a deciding vote in case of a tie, and high-level representatives of the following academic institutions:

- **Georgetown University**
- **Getulio Vargas Foundation**
- **Hebrew University of Jerusalem**
- **University of Cape Town**
- **Nova University of Lisbon**

14. The decisions of the Jury are not subject to appeal.

15. Eventual omissions in this Regulation shall be assessed by the Organization and its decision shall be final.
