It's official! The 8th edition of the Estoril Conferences will take place on **September 1**st and 2nd, 2023.

From this edition onwards, the **Estoril Conferences** will occur annually at Nova SBE's Carcavelos Campus, Cascais.

"Re-Humanize our World" is the motto of the 8th edition, which aims to promote an inspiring dialogue between world leaders and all generations, with a special focus on young people.

The Estoril Conferences are a local initiative with global impact, with recognized relevance for generating broad reflection and sharing knowledge, and crucial as a call for action with awareness.

The Estoril Conferences are based on 4 pillars, **Planet**, **Peace**, **Policy**, and **People/Health**, and speakers will focus on initiatives and solutions to promote a fairer, more equitable, sustainable, and inclusive future.

Carcavelos, march 10, 2023 – The Estoril Conferences return in 2023 to Nova SBE's Carcavelos Campus and, starting this year, in an annual format. Promoted by **Nova SBE** and co-organized with **NOVA Medical School**, this event is, once again, supported by the **Municipality of Cascais** and **Turismo de Portugal** as co-hosts. The first day of the event (September 1st) is dedicated to the broader themes Planet, Peace, and Policies), being the second day (September 2nd) reserved for Health and People.

The main goal of the Estoril Conferences, which the motto this year is "Re-Humanize our World": Planet, People, Peace, Policy, and People/Health", is to foster the participation of high-level world leaders from the social, economic, political, and health spheres, as well as social activists and the younger generations, in an inspiring dialogue to incite action and create effective changes towards a more just, equitable, sustainable, and inclusive future.

What are we doing for People, Planet, Peace, Health, and New Policies? How can we help Re-Humanize our planet? How can we be more active and effective in finding solutions? What is our responsibility towards the younger generations? How can we work together to bring about this change? are some of the questions that will be addressed in the reflection that intends to involve civil society, politicians, world leaders, and, above all, the younger generations in an inspiring debate that promotes action.











The Estoril Conferences are co-organized by **Nova SBE, NOVA Medical School, Cascais City Council**, and **Tourism of Portugal.** The organization of the 8th edition has a renewed team under the **executive direction** of **Laurinda Alves**. In 2023, the Estoril Conferences will also begin a new cycle, becoming an annual event.

'Re-Humanizing is not just a good idea, it is a practice that when put into action improves life in all its aspects' says the Executive Director of the Estoril Conferences, Laurinda Alves, adding 'over the years, the Estoril Conferences have been asserting their relevance in Portugal and the world. We want to be one of the engines of this movement and open paths to a more humanized future.'

On the road to the Estoril Conferences

Throughout 2023, and in line with the call-to-action launched at the end of the 2022 edition, the Estoril Conferences will promote a set of actions to encourage the participation of society in building a path to a more sustainable future based on equality, equity, justice, and peace.

During March, the **On the Road to the Estoril Conferences** includes a televised debate, in partnership with CNN Portugal, about Artificial Intelligence and ChatGPT (on March 17), a debate promoted by NOVA Medical School on "Health Technology - What is the common ground?" (March 23), and a Solidarity Concert to raise funds to support education in Turkey and Syria (March 30).

The 2023 edition of the Estoril Conferences

Under the motto Re-Humanize the World: Planet, Peace, Policy, and People/Health, the Estoril Conferences present a two-day agenda that challenges an open and inclusive dialogue about a more sustainable future based on equality, equity, justice, and peace.

Dozens of speakers, divided between the main stage and parallel sessions, will participate in the Estoril Conferences with a mission to inspire immediate action and commitment. Climate change, the road to sustainability, technology for social impact, emerging health issues, mental health, education systems, trust in political institutions, and the power of the media; as well as critical questions about the future of democracy and resistance to populism, war conflicts, and the refugee crisis, for a peaceful future in Europe and the world, are some of the topics that will be addressed. The world's leading business and health schools will be side-by-side with great leaders and agents of change in a common mission to educate and inspire young and future leaders to build a common future where peace, justice, health, sustainability, and inclusion can thrive.

The Estoril Conferences aim to respond to the urgent need to act and engage young people in discussing the global challenges emerging today (and soon), addressing some of the most pressing issues through research and innovative initiatives. This effort to empower young people to become active citizens in democracy and society, increasing their sense of belonging, aligns with the strategies of the "Next EU













Research & Innovation Investment Programme 2021-2027: Horizon Europe", the EU Youth Strategy and the UN Sustainable Development Goals, reinforcing the active role of the Estoril Conferences in finding solutions to the major challenges facing the world.

The event is free, however, registration is mandatory with a limited number of seats.
