## EC 2017: LEAVING HOME IN A GLOBALIZED WORLD

The 5<sup>th</sup> edition of the Estoril Conferences focused on one of the biggest challenges not only of globalization but of the XXI century: the largest migratory movement since World War II.

'Leaving Home in a Globalized World' discussed the current migrant tendencies and the main reasons behind it, the perception of both the origin and host societies involved and the means to ensure safe and legal migration.

As broad subject related to many aspects of human society such as culture, human rights, economy, freedom, environment, peace, politics, security, solidarity, terrorism and others, migration was approached in two distinct categories: migration as a challenge and migration in times of crisis.

Migration as a challenge reflected the subject as a natural human phenomenon, outside the context of an imminent crisis and one that has been happening ever since.

Migration in times of crisis sought to provide insight on the current migration crisis and the challenges it brings to both the countries of origin and those that welcome the new flows of migrants.

To the stage, the Estoril Conferences welcomed reputable speakers from diverse ideological, professional, academic and geographic origins. Together, through dialogue, they generated an enriched heritage of knowledge and know-how, with the purpose of changing the world.

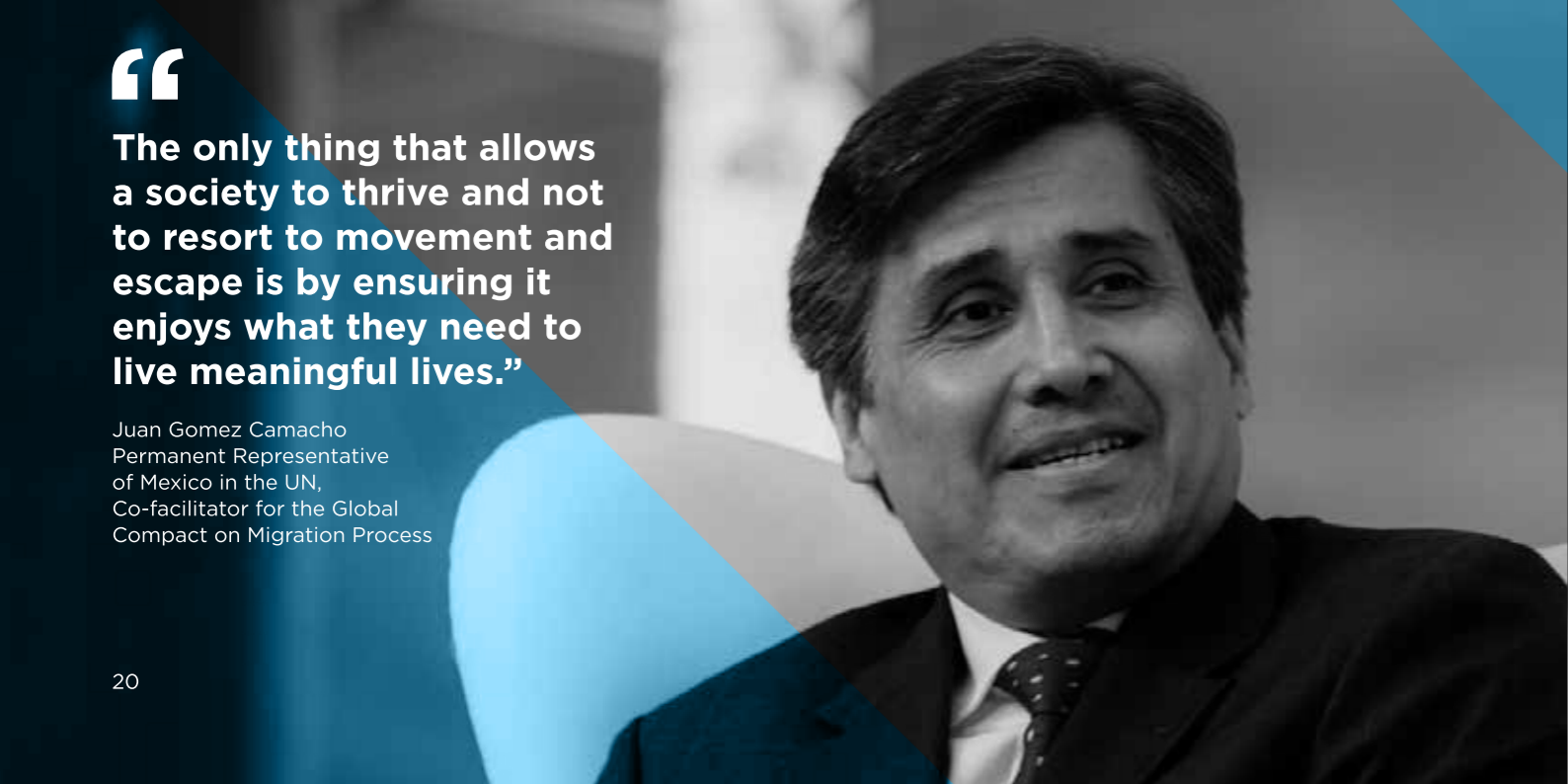

The Estoril Local Answers Award was formally presented in a Soirée that counted with the participation of the Portuguesa Fado singer Mariza.

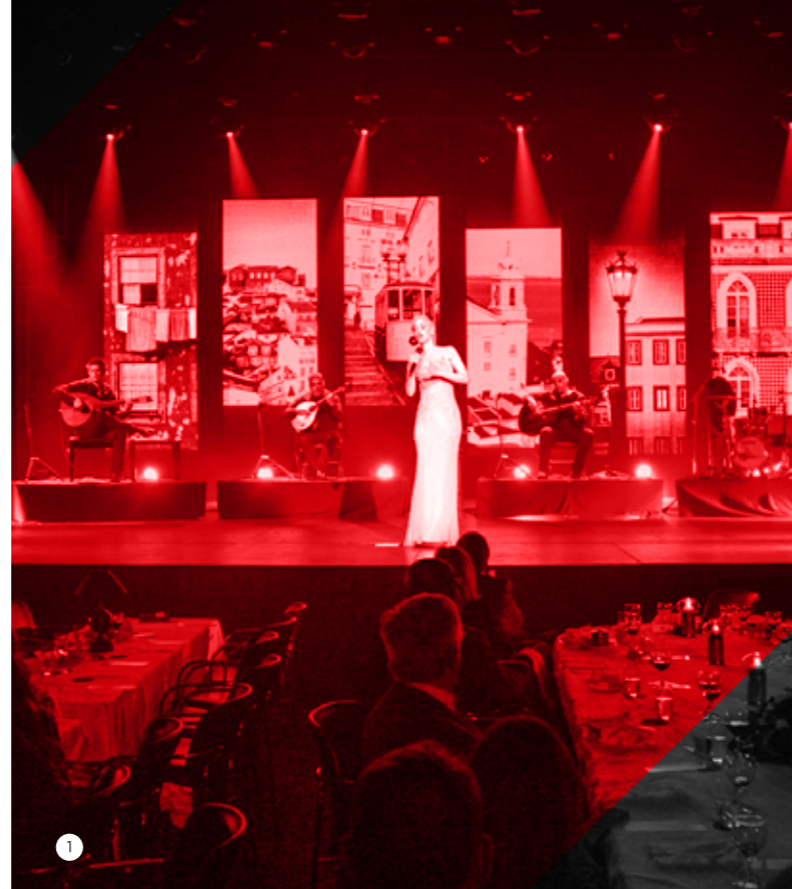
**Global Cafés and Local Impact Labs (LILs):**

## Art Exhibitions

Four different art exhibitions were displayed in the 'Experience Lounge'

'Paths of Hope and Despair' by EC'17 speaker Yannis Behrakis, the Greek Reuters photojournalist and winner of several international photography awards. Without intruding, Yannis Behrakis witnessed and photographed for the entire world to see the paths of hope and despair walked by millions of migrants. For nearly three decades he has been a witness of the mass movement of people: in the Middle East, in the Balkans and in Europe. His lens has captured the hopes of new beginnings and the despair of many endings.

Doctors Without Borders held two different installations:

'The Greek Beach' or 'La Plage' was a large panel representing a Greek beach with all the items left behind by migrants, including lifejackets, papers, keys, and others.

'Temporary Intimacies' or 'Intimités Temporaires' was a photo exhibition taken by photograph Bruno Fert of different shelters of the infamous French camp entitled 'The Jungle'.

The fourth art exhibition was 'SAFE' which stands for 'Social Art Festival Estoril'.

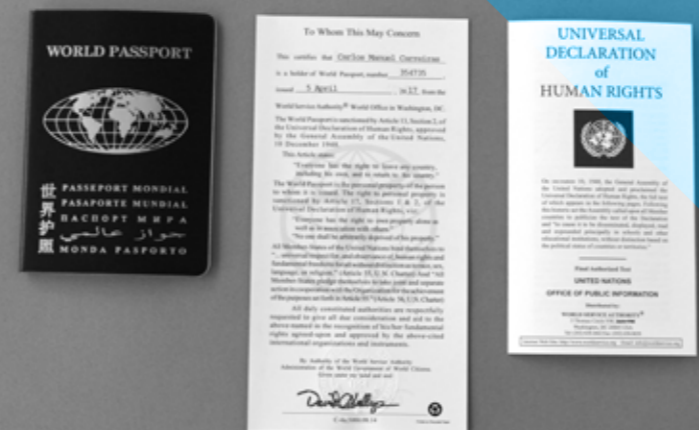
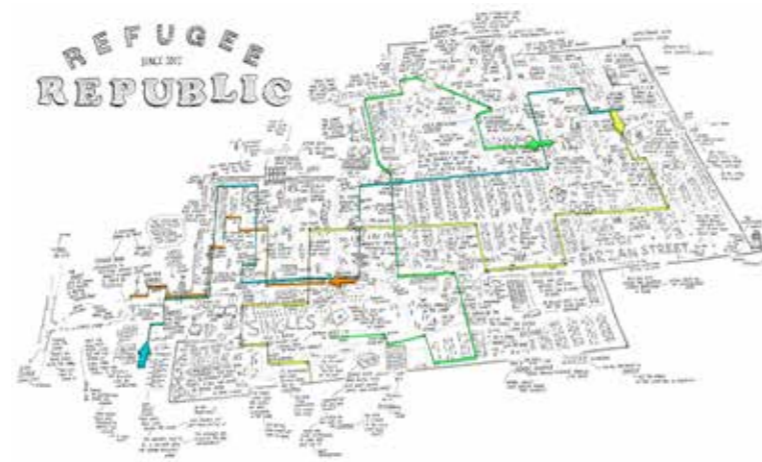
'SAFE' was a joint project between the Estoril Conferences and *Fundação Dom Luís I* with the goal of presenting the global challenges of our current world through contemporary art.

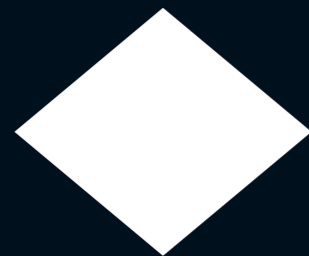

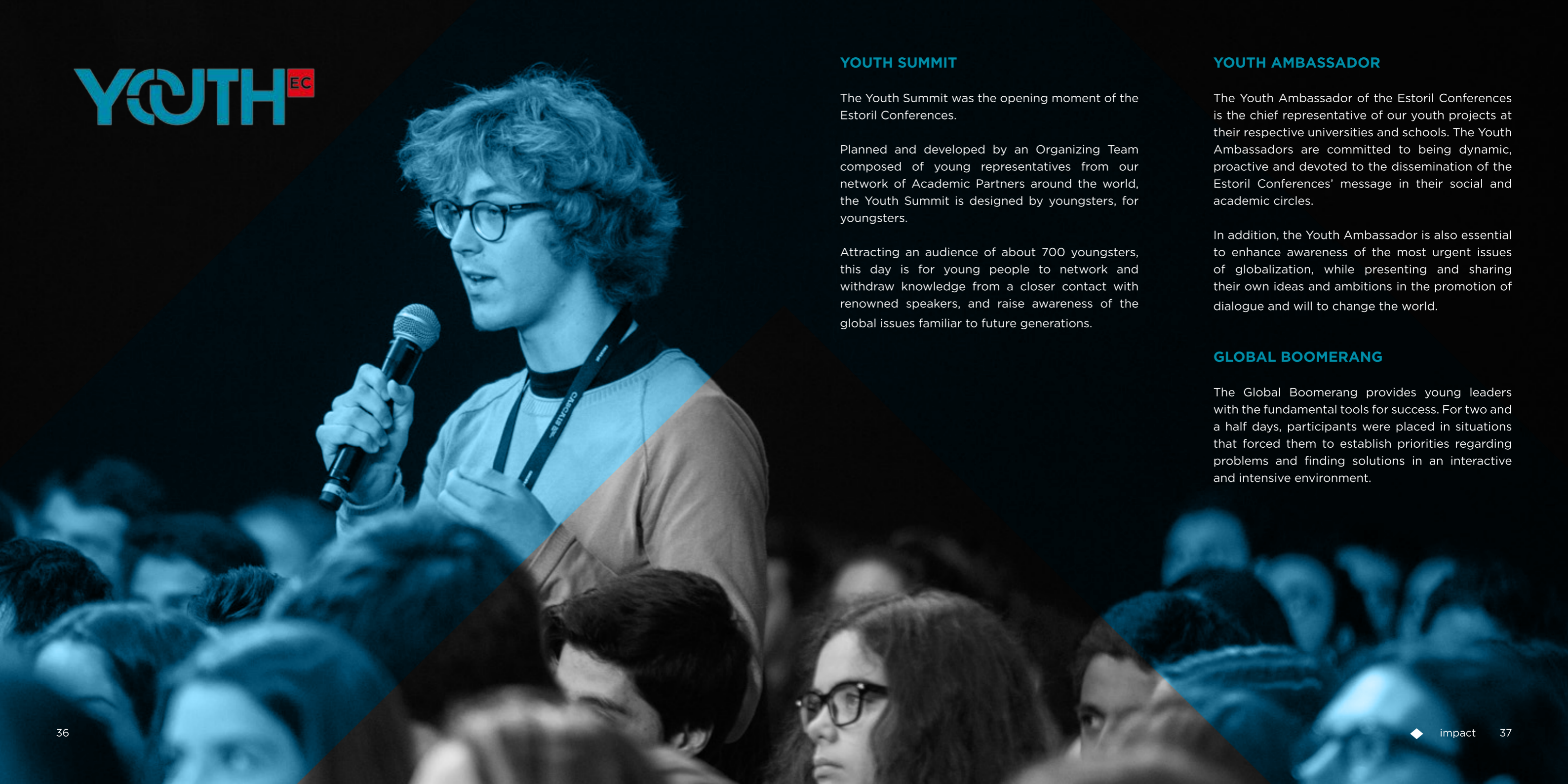
The challenge presented to children, supported in the book “Vou ali e já venho: sobre migrações e comichões” was to present the human race to aliens.

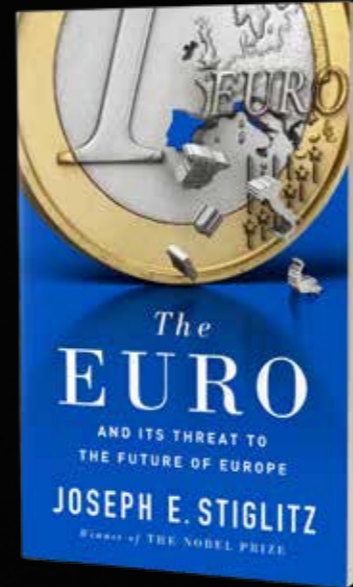
